Air Force



The Air Force, together with Land Forces, represents the main combat element of any armed forces. The principal task of the Air Force is to secure the integrity of the Czech Republic's airspace. This mission is fulfilled within NATO Integrated Air Defence System (NATINADS) and, if necessary, by means of the national reinforced air defence system of the Czech Republic. In addition, the Air Force performs tasks associated with transportation of troops and material.

The Air Force has to be built up in order to gradually achieve interoperability with an integrated system of air defence and, at the same time, to be able to perform other missions enhancing operational capabilities of Land Forces of both coalition and non-coalition forces as well as the capabilities of intended task forces of own ground forces.

Enhancement of total operational capabilities of the Air Force requires procurement of new equipment as well as substantial upgrade of the existing one.
