POSSIBLE ANSWERS – exercise 9)

These answers are just examples. Students may suggest other possibilities.

- A SQUAD FALL IN RIGHT DRESS EYES FRONT RIGHT TURN BY THE FRONT QUICK MARCH LEFT RIGHT LEFT RIGHT LEFT RIGHT LEFT
- B PRIVATE WOOK SHUN ONE PACE STEP FORWARD MARCH! ABOUT TURN! ONE PACE STEP FORWARD MARCH ABOUT TURN STAND AT ... EASE!
- C A COMPANY COMPANY SHUN! RIGHT DRESS EYES FRONT STAND AT ... EASE!

 After the commander s arrival:

 COMPANY COMPANY SHUN! PRESENT ARMS SHOULDER ARMS ORDER ARMS STAND AT ... EASE!
- D FALL IN RIGHT DRESS EYES FRONT GENERAL SALUTE PRESENT ARMS SHOULDER ARMS ORDER ARMS!

 STAND AT ... EASE! (e.g. during the speech) SHUN! FALL OUT! (after general s departure)
- E LOAD READY TARGET IN FRONT ONE ROUND ... FIRE! UNLOAD GUN CLEAR.
