Educational objective:

Place and role of the field artillery battery (platoon) in fire support to a task force.











Content:

1) Grouping of artillery for fire support to task forces

In order to provide complex and effective Fire Support the FA assets (units) are grouped by superior commander.

Grouping of artillery means:

- assigment of FA units for the standard Indirect Fire Support (IFS) tactical missions (DS, GS, GSR)
- reinforcement of combat (maneuver) formations/TF by FA
- displacement of FA to combat formation

Groupings of FA established before combat is changing in the course of the combat, depending on development of tactical situation and tasts.











1) Grouping of artillery for fire support to task forces

Reinforcement of combat (maneuver) formations/TF **by FA** is organized by commanding officer superior to both, and it can be:

- assignment DS usually)
 - under direct control of TF COM
 - TACOM
- allocation for support (attachment for specific FS tasks -GS, GSR)
 - remains under control of its FA COM
 - provides FS to FT COM in tasked areas, time or trgs











1) Grouping of artillery for fire support to task forces

Grouping of FA for ACR Task forces

- 4th/7th BCT assignment of Arty Bn incl. FSCC
- Bn TF assignment
 - up to FA firing battery
 - always FSC cell + Arty Recce TA Platoon
- Coy TF assignment of Arty Recce TA Squad + mortar/arty firing unit











Combat formation is structured displacement (system) of elements of artillery units (formations) necessary for the preparation, direction and execution of both artillery fire and maneuver

- To displace into a combat formation the FA unit COM to determine:
 - firing areas,
 - command post area,
 - observation post areas for Arty Recce TA means under his/her command.











ArtyBn combat formation = ArtyBn PAA + Arty Recce TA means:

- main CP including FDC,
- combat formation of its firing batteries,
- observation post areas of directly commanded Arty Recce TA means,
- rear Bn area (CSS logistic and medical support).

Firing/mortar Bty combat formation = Bty PAA:

- CP = Bty FDC
- 1-3 up to 4 firing positions
- covering position
- covering position for ammo and/or towing vehicle












Tactical norms for PAA

- Arty Bn 3-6 by 3-6 kms, 1 km between Bty`s, 2-6 kms behind FEBA
- Arty Bty 1-2 by 1-2 kms, 2-6 kms behind FEBA
- SpM Bty 1-2 by 1-2 kms, 1-4 kms from FEBA
- M Bty 1 by 1.5 kms, 1-4 kms from FEBA













Battery Firing Position

- a leg of terrain prepared and/or occupied by firing unit to launch fire,
- · prepared or unprepared,
- · covered or uncovered against the ground optical recce,
- occupied by unit just for (before) launching the fire,
- shoot and scoot tactics











3) Combat capabilities

Combat capabilities refer on the ability of an artillery unit (firing batteries) to meet the requirements for fire support of combat units.

- calculated by FSO (FSCOORD) at FSCC/FSC cell,
- reported to Arty and supported COM,
- used for FS planning and Bty tasks management.











3) Combat capabilities

Combat capabilities division in ACR Arty:

- maneuver and tactical movements capabilities
- firing capabilities
- Arty Recce TA capabilities
- Arty C2IS capabilities
