1) Place and role of FA battery in defensive tactical activities

Defensive tactical activities perform units to repel the enemy who is in superiority in order to inflict losses and prevent his achievement of success in battle.

Defensive tactical actions (tactics, technics and procedures, TTPs) can weaken the enemy, but one cannot use them to achieve victory in battle.

<u>Defensive operationas</u>

- defence operations
 - defend in sector
 - defend from a battle position
- delay operations











1) Place and role of FA battery in defensive tactical activities

Field artillery – via conducting fire support creates condition for combat forces (units) to accomplish their defensive mission given.

- FA general support (GS) tactical mission at defence
 - tube artillery
 - mortar units
- FA direct support (DS) tactical mission at defence











2) Fire support tasks in the course of defence

The determining factor in planning defensive operations is the depth of uncover of the enemy intends (course of action).

Conduct of defensive battle - Concept of operation

- division into phases
 - maneuver of combat units
 - supporting fires (FS)











2) Fire support tasks in the course of defence

Standard FS tactical tasks at the defence

- fire engagement of enemy troops advancing to own lines
- fire support in the sector of covering forces (units)
- fire support to repel assault onto main line of own defence
- fire support in the depth of own defence sector
- fire support for counter-attack

Suppression of Eny air assets actions – key enabling factor for FA operations











3) System of fire engagement

- planning for defending operation is based on assumed enemy COA
- fires of all combat assets (incl. artillery) are planned to areas (directions) of potential Eny advance
- fire sectors (areas of engagement) are to overlap, planned in both depth and widths, supporting maneuver, covering obstacles
- FS part of Fire Engagement System (FES)
- FES TF COM responsibility











4) Combat formation

Positioning Areas for Artillery (PPA)

- use of max. available area to support sustainability and force protection
 - engineering (hardening) of positions
 - dispersion and maneuver
 - providing for security and self-defense in PAA











4) Combat formation

Main Positioning Area for Artillery (PAA)

- Tube artillery: 3-6 kms behind own front defensive line (FEBA)
- Mortar units: 1-2 kms behind FEBA

Alternate PAA

- into depth at least one 3-5 kms behind front-line maneuver Bns
- into width in case of defending widths front

Temporary PAA

- nearby front defenvive line (FEBA) single batteries
- maximum range enegagement GS task











5) Maneuver in the course of defence

Maneuver between Main and Alternate PAA

- on order or in consent of superior (TF) COM
 - sequenced relocation of PAA
 - (un)availability of FA fire support calculation
 - tactical move 3 kms per minute

Maneuver within PAA

- under command of Bty CO
 - calculation of all available options











6) Tactics and procedures in the course of defence

Bty activities by Standard FS Tactical Tasks for defence:

- fire engagement of enemy troops advancing to own lines
- fire support in the sector of covering forces (units)
- fire support to repel assault onto main line of own defence
- fire support in the depth of own defence sector
- fire support for counter-attack











7) Battery commanding procedures in the course of defence

Assignment of FA Bty to a BnTF in Defend in secrtor/from position operation is non-standard (see concentration of force and fire principle for FA)

- tasks for FSE (FSCC FSCOORD) as a part of TF COM recce over the front line of sector to defend
- tasks for Bty CO in the course of recce over the sector to defend
- tasks for Bty (ArtyBn) given by OPORD and Annex E Fire Support
 - OPORD FA Bty wihin ArtyBn
 - OPORD Mortar Bty (FA Bty) within BnTF
- tasks to subordinates by a FA Plt Leader OPORD











8) Delay operations

The aim of Delay Ops is to exhaust the Eny and keep own fighting strength

- exchange of space for time
- combat power of FA has to be considerate for the future combat, in another area and time

FA in Delay Ops

- high demand on maneuver and coordination with maneuvering combat units
 - limited time for FS planning
 - focus on fire safety regulations (avoid fratricide fires)
 - heavy application fire coordination measures (avoid fratricide fires)
- higher number of PAA 4-10 kms for maneuver











8) Delay operations

FS tactical task – depends on supported TF COM CONOPS

- concentrated fires and platton fires
 - to delay and effectively weaken Eny
 - prevent bypassing of own troops
 - prevent destruction of own obsteclas
- fire barrages to stop (slow down) Eny advance
- covering fires to support disengagement of own troops
- smoke fire mission











9) Tactics and procedures for defence in specific conditions

- mountains and forests ops
- urban area ops
- night time ops
- water obstacle crossing point ops
- withdrawal
