

## Military meteorology – VOCABULARY

<b>research</b> /rɪ'sɜ:(r)tʃ/	the detailed study of something in order to discover new facts, especially in a university or scientific institution
<b>large-scale</b> /lɑ:(r)dʒ//skeɪl/	involving a large number of people or things, or happening over a large area
<b>campaign</b> /kæm'peɪn/	a series of actions by an army trying to win a war
<b>dependent</b> /dɪ'pendənt/	needing the help or support of someone or something else
<b>forecast</b> /'fɔ:(r)kɑ:st/	a statement about what is likely to happen, based on available information and usually relating to the weather, business, or the economy
<b>fate</b> /feɪt/	the things that happen to someone, especially unpleasant things
<b>resemble</b> /rɪ'zemb(ə)l/	to be similar to someone or something, especially in appearance
<b>tripod</b> /'traɪpɒd/	an object with three legs that is used for supporting something such as a camera
<b>precipitation</b> /prɪ,sɪpɪ'teɪʃ(ə)n/	<i>SCIENCE</i> rain, snow, hail etc.; <i>CHEMISTRY</i> the process by which a solid substance separates, or is separated from, a liquid it is in
<b>crucial</b> /'kru:ʃ(ə)l/	something that is extremely important because it has a major effect on the result of something
<b>vicissitudes</b> /vaɪ'sɪsə,tʃu:dz/	changes and unexpected difficulties
